PLANNING STATEMENTS FOR THREE YEAR PLANS PEACE LIARD REGIONAL ARTS COUNCIL

Proposed programs should be drafted in the form of a planning statement. Planning statements must pass the SMAC Test: they must be specific, measurable, achievable and congruent with the goals of the organization.

Planning statements should address the following areas:

- 1. Rationale: what is the problem, need or issue?
- 2. Value: why should the community care?
- 3. Purpose: how will the problem, need or issue be addressed?
- 4. Client: who will it serve?
- 5. Goals: what is the intended outcome? (in three years)
- 6. Objectives: what will be achieved this year?
- 7. Methods: how will you meet your objectives?
- 8. Management: who is going to do what?
- 9. Phasing: what report and policies will arise from the project?
- 10. Evaluation: how will you measure your success or failure? (qualitatively and quantitatively)?
