

Jurors' Job Description and Guidelines (Internal)

Art education background
Previous jury experience if possible
Insight into northern artistic expression
Ability to communicate contemporary art concepts and issues
Willingness to speak with the artists regarding their work
Written critique is not mandatory

Method

The juror(s) will be given one day to view and jury the exhibit.

The juror(s) will choose: 1-Distinguished Award (\$1,000)

1-Recognition Award (\$500)

1-Most Experimental Award (\$200)

9-Chosen Awards

Up to 10 Honourable Mention Awards

The juror(s) should be available to attend the public opening and give a brief address to the gathering.

The juror(s) will be available to conduct an "artist walkthrough" the morning following the opening reception, to give verbal critiques in a positive and constructive manner to the artists in attendance.

Shadow Juror (optional)

Any regional artist or art supporter can apply for this position. The Shadow Juror will be chosen by the PLRAC in consultation with the local arts council where the RJAE is being held.

The Shadow Juror will not act as a juror for the exhibit but will observe the process and learn from the juror(s).

Accommodation and meals may be covered by the hosting community arts council (at the discretion of the hosting arts council).
