The Peace Liard Regional Arts Council (PLRAC) and the Dawson Creek Art Gallery would like to congratulate Karl Mattson for having been selected for the AIR program in 2019. We are honoured to present Karl's newly created exhibition *Thoughts of Love, Meditations of Violence* in the spiral exhibition space of the Dawson Creek Art Gallery.

The AIR program, administered by the PLRAC with support from the BC Arts Council, provides a northeast BC artist with concentrated time to work on their art in a studio setting along with mentorship from a professional artist/curator culminating in a solo exhibition.

The program, which the PLRAC hopes will become an annual opportunity, was developed to assist the region's artists in gaining time for their practice as well as furthering their exposure and professional status.

The 2019 submissions to the Artist in Residence program were adjudicated by Paul Crawford, curator of the Penticton Art Gallery, and nationally renowned artist Peter von Tiesenhausen from Demmit, Alberta.

Paul also participated as a mentor during the creative process, generously offering to share his experience and expertise with our local artists and arts organizations.


While rattling around my farm, sorting through the experience of middle age, I hope to engage the viewer on a visceral level as I explore my elusive migration toward finding meaning. My artistic explorations have taken me to the Arctic of Norway where I bore witness to the awe of calving glaciers, ancient ecospheres dissolving into the archipelagos of Spitsbergen.

Along with this are my constants that continually challenge me - a personal wrangling with thoughts of existence and the never ending push of industry around my farm. I have utilized the PLRAC residency to expand a focus on the interactions between the environment and its inhabitants to include the individuals who have stood beside me in the struggle to find inner peace within an ever-changing environment. This exhibition searches for a beauty within the nature of our world's low violent hum of climate change, the slow death march of humankind's complacency.




